Great Lakes has been offering this unique program to the 11th standard students, enlightening them on entrepreneurship and management - as a CSR initiative for the past 6 years. The Chief Guest for the occasion was Mr. Sukumar Rajagopal, Former SVP, CIO & Head of Innovation at Cognizant Technology Solutions.

The program is for two year duration, with a total of 200 hours of learning, spread over 18 months. It includes field visits to corporate establishments and business practical sessions for 1 month at the end of the first year under the guidance of professors or industry experts in a business house of their choice approved by Great Lakes. The program is focused on activities under Entrepreneurship forum to inculcate and develop the spirit of entrepreneurship among young students.
