Janmashtami Celebration!



Never in my wildest imagination did I dream that I would enjoy Gokulastami this way! Born and brought up in Chennai, Gokulastami was always celebrated in a different manner. Decorating our houses with footprints of the child Lord Krishna, using flour made from rice, making sweets appetisers and going to the Temple are the rituals followed in major parts of South India. I was accustomed to seeing Matki Phod in movies but it's a different experience to see it live for the very first time. Matki Phod is a tradition widely followed in Northern parts of India. Matki Phod, a ceremony where a decorated pot containing curd, with a coconut placed at the mouth of the pot, supported by poles is hung at a certain height. A group of 20 to 30 men gather together to form a Human Pyramid to reach the pot and break it with the coconut placed on the pot.





The evening's celebrations kick started with the dance competitions. Despite the time constraints our seniors delivered power packed performances that added more excitement to the ongoing merriment. Once the last performance ended, announcements for Matki Phod was made. The maiden team gathered around to scale the immeasurable height to reach out to the pot.
