## 'B-school grads need to be sensitive to industry's goals'

Ten business schools were awarded for best practices in management education at the 4th Indian Management Conclave held at New Delhi over the weekend.

The silver award winners were Jaipuria Institute of Managemoent for creating an integrated and engaging online platform; Indian Institute of Management, Kashipur for Design and Delivery of courses with Industry Support; Goa Institute of Management, Goa for Give GOA Initiative; IFIM Business School, Bangalore for Industry Internship Programme; Institute for Technology and Management (ITM), Navi Mumbai for Radically different iConnect Programme.

The awards, instituted by the online portal MBAUniverse.com, is given in recognition of successful initiatives by management institutes to enhance the value of their MBA programmes.

A total of over 50 entries were received from B-schools and departments of management of universities across India.
